5 6	ARTICLE I
7	NAME AND PURPOSE
8 9	Section 1. Name: The name of the corporation shall be the American Osteopathic Colleges of
10	Ophthalmology and Otolaryngology-Head, and Neck Surgery (herein referred to as "AOCOO-
11	HNS").
12	
13	Section 2. Purposes: The purposes for which the AOCOO-HNS is organized are to:
14	a. Develop, monitor, and maintain educational standards for the initial and continuing
15	training of osteopathic physicians in ophthalmology, otolaryngology, head, and neck
16	surgery.
17	
18	b. Involve practitioners of these specialties in academic, social, economic, and political issues
19	relative to their specific area of practice.
20	
21	c. Support the osteopathic profession, our specialties and the good of the public.
22	
23	ARTICLE II
24	BOARD OF GOVERNORS
25	
26	Section 1. Responsibilities: The activities of the AOCOO-HNS shall be managed by the Board of
27	Governors (herein referred to as the "Board"). The Board shall have the power to do and perform
28	all acts and functions consistent with these Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation of the State
29	of Ohio.

1	Individual Board members are responsible to vote on issues presented to the board but, have no			
2	authority to act on its behalf, unless given that authority by the president of the colleges.			
3				
4	Respo	onsibilities of the Board shall include:		
5	a.	Maintaining a system whereby the fiscal assets of the AOCOO-HNS are under constant		
6		surveillance and accountability, including a full financial statement prepared by a		
7		certified public accountant annually, and interim reports as are necessary.		
8				
9	b.	Establishing and maintaining an effective planning process whereby needs of the AOCOO-		
10		HSN may be identified and resources allocated to meet those needs, expressly granted by		
11		the Colleges.		
12				
13	c.	Selection of the executive director of the AOCOO-HNS and the delineation of his or her		
14		duties and responsibilities.		
15				
16	d.	Reviewing reports of the Standing Committees and taking appropriate actions on the		
17		recommendations of these committees.		
18				
19	e.	Establishing the fees, dues, and assessments for each class of membership annually.		
20				
21		on 2. Number and Qualification. The Board of Governors shall consist of twelve	Formatted: Font color: Red	
22 23		Aembers. The Board of Governors shall be comprised of members from both the American		
23 24	Osteopathic College of Ophthalmology and the American Osteopathic College of Otolaryngology- Head and Neck Surgery, who are fellows of their college.			
25				
26	Sectio	on 3. <u>Election and Tenure</u> . Members-at-Large and Secretary/Treasurer shall be elected by a		
27	major	ity vote of the general membership from the names recommended by the Nominating		
28	Comn	nittee to the Board of Governors. Mail ballots will be cast between March 1 and March 31,		
29	with ı	results reported to the Board at its Annual Business Meeting. With the exception of the		
30	<u>Imme</u>	diate Past-President, no officer may serve in an office for more than one (1) year.		
31				

1	The terms of office of the Board Officers shall be one (1) year or until their successors are elected.	
2		
3	Members-at-Large may be re-elected for a maximum of two three-year staggered terms. The	
4	Board shall have the power to fill the existing vacancies for the remainder of any expired term at	
5	a regular meeting of the Board. (Rev. 6/10)	
6		
7	Section 4. Resignation and Removal. Any Board Member may resign by giving written notice to	
8	the Secretary/Treasurer. The Board may remove any elected Board Member from his or her	
9	position at any time by a two-thirds ( $\frac{2}{3}$ ) vote of the Board.	
10		
11	Section 5. Officers. The Officers shall consist of a President, President-elect, Vice President,	
12	Secretary/Treasurer and two (2) Past Presidents. The President, President-elect, and Vice	
13	President will be elected by the members of the Board of Governors to a one (1) year term. The	
14	Secretary/Treasurer will be elected by the general membership of the AOCOO-HNS.	
15		
16	Physicians running for the office of Secretary/Treasurer must be Members-at-Large of the	
17	Board for at least two (2) years and selected by the Nominating Committee from the Members-	
18	at-Large. Occasionally, the Board of Governors may find it necessary to fill the office of	
19	Secretary/Treasurer with a specialist that is from the same specialty as the officer holding the	
20	office year prior. The Board will make every attempt to maintain a pattern which alternates	
21	between the specialty areas.	
22		
23	A majority vote of the general membership of the AOCOO-HNS shall be required for election of	
24	Members-at-Large of the Board of Governors. Ballots will be cast, and then reported at the	
25	Annual Business Meeting.	
26		
27	a. <u>President</u> . The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Governors and the	
28	Executive Committee. The President may delegate this duty to the Vice-President. The	

29 President is ex-officio member of all committees of the Colleges. He or she shall also serve

1 as President/Chairman of their respective specialty college.

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- <u>President Elect</u>. The President-Elect shall perform the duties delegated to that office by
   the Board of Governors. The President-Elect shall also serve as the President/Chairman
   of the respective College.
- c. <u>Vice-President</u>. The Vice-President shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of
  the President in his or her absence and shall perform other duties as shall be prescribed
  by the Board. The Vice-President shall also serve as Vice Chairman of their respective
  specialty college.
- 11 d. Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible for keeping a 12 permanent record of the proceedings of the AOCOO-HNS and for a current roster of the 13 members. The Secretary shall perform all other duties that usually pertain to the office of 14 Secretary. In addition, the Secretary/Treasurer shall receive an accounting of all Income, 15 Expenses, and Investments on a regular basis per accepted accounting procedures. The 16 Secretary/Treasurer shall keep a complete and permanent record of the financial transactions of the AOCOO-HNS. The Treasurer shall make a full financial report at the 17 Board of Governors Meetings and shall perform all other duties as may be determined by 18 19 the Board. The Secretary/Treasurer shall serve as Vice Chairman of their respective 20 College.
- e. <u>Past President</u>. The Past President shall perform duties delegated to that office by the
   Board of Governors. <u>The Past President shall serve on the Board of Governors' for two (2)</u>
   consecutive years.

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Section 6. Executive Director. The administrative and day-to-day operation of the Colleges shall be the responsibility of a salaried staff individual, responsible to the Board of Governors. The salaried staff individual shall have the title of "Executive Director". The Executive Director shall have the authority to execute contracts of behalf of the college and as approved by the Board of Governors. The Executive Director may carry out such other duties as may be specified by the Board of Governors. The Executive Director shall employ, and may terminate the employment of, members of the staff necessary to carry out the work of the College. Except as otherwise set forth in these Bylaws, the Executive Director shall be invited to attend and participate in all
 meetings of the Board of Governors and its Executive Committee in an Ex-Officio, non-voting
 capacity.

Section 7. The Executive and Finance Committee of the Board shall consist of the Officers of the
Board of Governors. The Executive Director shall serve as secretary without vote. The Chairman
of the Committee of Medical Education shall serve on the Executive Committee as a non-voting
Consultant.

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Section 8. <u>Nominating Committee</u>. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five (5) members,
 and these shall be the two (2) Past Presidents, the President-Elect who shall act as Chairman, the
 Vice President, and a Member-at-Large. The Nominating Committee shall recommend the names
 of persons to be considered for election as Secretary/Treasurer and Members-at-Large of the
 Board of Governors.

16 Section 9. Meetings of the Board of Governors. Regular meetings of the Board shall be held at 17 least twice annually at a time and place designated by the Board. The purposes of the annual 18 meeting shall be to present annual reports and conduct business that comes before the Board. 19 The Board may call for other meetings to be held, as it may deem necessary. Members of the 20 Board may participate in any meeting by a conference telephone or similar electronic 21 communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear 22 each other, and such participation in a meeting shall constitute presence in person at the meeting. The conduct of all activities/meetings of the Boards/ Committees of the Colleges shall 23 24 be governed by Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, unless otherwise specified in these 25 Bylaws. (R-4/99) 26

27 Section 10. Disciplinary Action. The membership of any Member of the AOCOO-HNS, who

violates established policies of the AOCOO-HNS may be revoked, suspended, or placed on
probation by the Board of Governors acting per the procedures in the Bylaws, and has the right
of appeal to the Board of Governors following the mechanism as established by the AOA in their
Bylaws, Article 2, Section 3.

33	ARTICLE III
34	<u>COLLEGES</u>

Section 1. <u>Colleges.</u> The AOCOO-HNS shall be comprised of two (2) Colleges, the American
 Osteopathic College of Ophthalmology and the American Osteopathic College of Otolaryngology,
 Head, and Neck Surgery.

- Section 2. <u>Responsibilities</u>. The activities of a College shall be managed by its officers and
   appointed representatives. A College shall have the power to do and perform all acts and
   functions consistent with these Bylaws.

Section 3. <u>College Composition</u>. Each College shall have a College Board composed of five members, including a President/Chairman, Vice Chairman and three (3) Members-at-Large, which forms the composition of the Board of Governors representing the individual College. The Chairs of the Council of Regional Representatives shall also sit on the College Board, as non-voting members. (Rev. 5/3/06, 6/10)

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## 16 Section 4. Officer Responsibility.

- a. <u>President/Chairman</u>. The President/Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the College
   Board, appoint all committee members of the College, and be an ex-officio member of all
   committees, except the Nominating Committee. The President/Chairman shall submit a
   report to the Board of Governors at the AOCOO-HNS Midyear and annual meetings.
- b. <u>Vice-President</u>. The Vice-President shall perform duties as assigned by the College Board.
- Section 5. <u>Vacancies</u>. Vacancies in any position on the College Board shall be filled by
   appointment by the College President/Chair for the unexpired term of such office.
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Section 6. <u>Resignation</u>. A member of the College Board (Officer or Representative) may resign at
 any time, in writing, to the Secretary of the College. The resignation will become effective upon
 the date of receipt and acceptance.

Section 3. <u>Active Member.</u> Active Members must be graduates of a medical school accredited
 by the Council on Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA), have successfully completed a
 residency training program accredited by the AOA and/or ACGME, be licensed to practice
 Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery IN THE STATE(S) IN WHICH THEY PRACTICE, and be Board
 Eligible or Board Certified by the American Osteopathic Board of Ophthalmology, Otolaryngology
 Head and Neck Surgery (AOBOO) or the ABO (American Board of Ophthalmology or the
 American Board of Otolaryngology).

9 Section 4. Life Member. Life membership may be granted, upon application to the membership Senior membership may be granted, upon 10 Section 5. Senior Member. 11 application to the Board of Governors, to any individual who would otherwise be eligible to be 12 an active member, but has been a member in good standing for twenty-five years, and is 13 sixty (60) years of age or over, and is either permanently retired or still practicing 14 ophthalmology, otolaryngology and/or head and neck surgery but has not 15 met the criteria for life membership.

Section 6. <u>Honorary Membership</u>. Honorary Membership in the College(s) may be granted to any
 person upon two-thirds (%) vote of the College(s) Board in recognition of meritorious service to
 the College(s) and/or the osteopathic profession. An honorary member will be assessed no dues
 and will not have the right to vote.

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Section 7. <u>Associate Membership.</u> Associate Membership may be granted to physicians who are: graduates of a medical school accredited by the Council of Osteopathic College Accreditation (COCA) or the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME), have successfully completed oneyear post-graduate training program accredited by the AOA and/or ACGME, and licensed to practice medicine or surgery in the state(s) in which they practice. Associate Membership is a non-voting status of membership in the AOCOO-HNS
Section 8. <u>Affiliate Membership.</u> Affiliate membership may be granted to the following medical

Section 8. <u>Affiliate Membership.</u> Affiliate membership may be granted to the following medical
 personnel: a physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or advanced certified technician in active
 clinical practice of ophthalmology, otolaryngology, and orofacial surgery. Affiliate Membership

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is a non-voting status of membership in the AOCOO-HNS and is not available to chiropractors,
 dentists, optometrists, or audiologists.

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Section 9. <u>Student Membership.</u> Student Membership may be granted to any individual who is
presently enrolled in a college of osteopathic medicine accredited by the Council of Osteopathic
College Accreditation (COCA) and exhibits a sincere interest in the specialty of ophthalmology or
otolaryngology-head and neck surgery.

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9 Section 10. <u>Dues, Fees, and Assessments.</u> There will be annual active member dues, new member 10 dues and candidate dues. There may also be other fees and assessment under the duties of the 11 Board of Governors: "It shall be responsible for establishing annually the dues, fees and 12 assessments for each class of membership." Only members who have satisfied their financial 13 obligations to the AOCOO-HNS shall be considered as members in good standing.

Section 11. Any member who fails to fulfill their financial obligations beyond sixty (60) days after official notification, shall be notified of suspension. After an additional thirty (30) days of delinquency, the member shall be automatically dropped from membership. The member has the right of appeal to the Board of Governors following the mechanism as established by the AOA in their Bylaws, Article 2, Section 3. (Rev. 2/7/04)

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Section 12. <u>Fellowship.</u> Members of the AOCOO-HNS may be granted the title of Fellow of the American Osteopathic College of Ophthalmology, or the American Osteopathic College of Otolaryngology- Head and Neck Surgery, who by outstanding contributions to the healing art, to the practice of Ophthalmology, or Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, to research or for such other meritorious services that reflect credit upon the AOCOOHNS and the osteopathic profession, who meets the requirements of the Awards Committee, shall with the approval of the Board, receive the honor of Fellow.

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1	Section 13. <u>Continuing Medical Education</u> . Members who are subject to the continuing medical	
2	education requirements of the AOA, shall maintain the required CME hours during a designated	
3	three (3) year period, of which at least one course shall be an AOCOO-HNS sponsored program.

8	WAIVER OF NOTICE	
9		
10	Whenever any notice is required to be given under applicable law, the articles of incorporation	
11	or these bylaws, waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such	
12	notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the	
13	giving of such notice.	
14		
15	ARTICLE VI	
16	INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS	
17		
18	The College shall indemnify and hold harmless all officers, directors and committee members of	
19	the College to the full extent permitted by the state of Ohio, as amended from time to time,	
20	and shall be entitled to purchase insurance for such indemnification of officers and directors to	
21	the full extent as determined from time to time by the Board of Governors.	
22		
23	ARTICLE VII	
24	AMENDMENTS	
25		
26	Amendments to the Bylaws may be proposed to the Board of Governors by the membership,	
27	committee, or board members, at least ninety (90) days prior to the next scheduled meeting of	
28	the Board.	

All amendments will be developed into resolutions, in accordance with the <u>Robert's Rules of</u>
 <u>Order, Newly Revised</u> and reviewed by the Rules and Bylaws Committee of the College.

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The Board of Governors will review proposed amendments and report back to the membership with their recommendation at the next regularly scheduled membership meeting. All proposed amendments will be submitted, in writing, to the full membership of the college a minimum of forty-five (45) days prior to the regularly scheduled annual membership meeting. Amendments to the Bylaws will require two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present to pass. Final action on amendments to the Bylaws will require action by the AOA Board of Trustees prior to enforcement.

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## ARTICLE VIII

## DISSOLUTION

14 In the event of the dissolution of the Colleges, the Board of Governors shall, after paying or 15 making provisions for the payment of all liabilities of the Colleges, dispose of all the remaining 16 assets of the Colleges (except any assets held by the Colleges upon condition requiring return, 17 transfer or other conveyance in the event of dissolution, which assets shall be returned, transferred or conveyed in accordance with such requirements) exclusively for the purposes of 18 19 the Colleges in such manner, or to such organization or organizations as shall at the time qualify 20 as a tax-exempt organization or organizations recognized under sections 501c(3) or 501c(6) of 21 the internal revenue code of 1986, as amended (the "code") or the corresponding provisions of 22 any future United States Internal Revenue Statute, as the Board of Governors shall determine. 23 Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of General Jurisdiction in 24 such a manner, or to such organization or organizations, which are organized and operated 25 exclusively for such purposes, as said court shall determine. 26 The above language pertains only to the American Osteopathic Colleges of Ophthalmology, 27 Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and does not affect the non-profit arm of this 28 organization.
